1. Past meeting notes

2. Team Updates

a. Third Party Team: Brent Struthers (team lead)

- Brent: Meeting twice a week to get the matrix complete.
 - NARUC meeting in St. Louis brought up privacy, and it was mentioned that FPF had a group that was creating best practices. They will have it by February.
 - Initial objections in NARUC meeting to what FPF is doing.
 - NAESB hits the smart meter data from the utility. What we are doing within our NIST subteam goes beyond just the utility smart meter data.

b. Privacy Use Cases Team: Christine Hertzog (team lead)

- Christine: Team continues work. Still hope to have the use cases done by end of December.

c. PEV Team: Mike Coop (team lead)

- Coop: Cancelling Monday calls.
 - 11/29, and 12/19 meeting. Will try to fit in a meeting between.
 - Just finished 2 days of ANSI F2F meeting. They are writing a road map on PEVs.
 - They are trying to boil the ocean like everyone else. They only mention privacy once in all their ~75 page document. Will try to influence and change that.
 - Trying to get a guideline/draft out by the end of this year. Coop will end up having to create most of the framework.
 - So, there is increased trans-Atlantic cooperation going on.
 - Big meeting on 11/28 between DHS and a European ambassador; a demonstration on e-mobility.
 - 3 compliance testing labs set up across the world. Looking at compliance, safety, etc.
 - Continue to try and influence privacy through those meetings. Actually having more progress with the U.S.
- Kotting: I can help with the writing.

- Tanya: I can help too.
 - Coop: Probably will schedule a 2-3 hour go-to-meeting to do this. Hopefully the week after Thanksgiving.
 - 3 candidates; 6 voters
- d. NSTIC Team: Krystina Schaefer/Amanda Stallings (team leads)
- Amanda: On hold and cruising.
- e. Training and Awareness Team: Rebecca Herold (team lead)
- Rebecca: Working on the PUC training slides.
 - Importance of the speaker notes to help those using the slides better understand the issues.
 - Get feedback; especially need feedback from the PUCs
 - Brent: Need for such slides at NARUC came up at the St. Louis meeting. Consumer affairs folks.
 - Rebecca: Will send the draft slides to Brent.

3. Miscellaneous

- a. Rebecca: Any interest in maintaining a list of laws/regs that cover smart grid privacy issues? Expanding upon the Appendix we have in NISTIR 7628 Vol 2. Is this already being done somewhere else?
- Ruth (FTC): Updating some related documents at the FTC.
 - Brent: NARUC doesn't have something like this.
 - Tanya: During NAESB effort they had folks look for laws, regs state by state. In the drafting process they had a list. IT's haphazard, but there was solid effort in trying to find such info. A draft of the draft process document. We could note that we obtained this from NARUC. That might helpful.
 - Brent: Once done with 3rd party I could lead the team to update the laws appendix.
 - Rebecca: We should include this in the next version of NISTIR 7628. Will be in spring.
 - Tanya: Should have a solid draft of version 2 in the April timeframe.
