Here are my summary notes from the meeting:

1. Team reports

- Privacy Use Cases Team: Christine Hertzog (team lead)
 - Revising existing privacy use cases template in NISTIR 7628; adding in privacy principles for each of the identified use cases. Will also apply the CPNI concepts. In 2 weeks Chris K and Erick S will cover the CPNI concepts. Will look at how they are addressing account information protection. No meeting next
- Third Party Team: Brent Struthers, Neustar (team lead)
 - Is at the CSWG outreach event in Atlanta.
 - The third party data access did not meet this week, and we will not meet next week.
- PEV Team: Mike Coop, Hey Coop! (team lead)
 - No report; team did not meet while Coop welcomed the birth of twins to his family!
- NSTIC Team: Rebecca filling in for Amanda Stallings, Ohio PUC (team lead)
 - Peter Neumann from SRI joined the group's discussion as a guest speaker last Friday. Mr. Neumann's discussion centered on security and trust. Mr. Neumann answered questions regarding customer identities about using certificates and how this information could relate to Smart Grid.
 - The group will wait for the final version of the NSTIC framework to release before really going into depth possible Smart Grid implications.
 - Tanya discussed a desire for a potential pilot project related to Smart Grid and the NSTIC framework.
 - Team moved to postpone any ideas until more information regarding the framework is received.
 - Next meeting will be Friday, November 19th at 2:00pm EST. There was no motion to change the day or time.
 - The team will NOT have a meeting during the week of Thanksgiving (November 22nd-26th)
