## **DHS Briefing on the Executive Order for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity – Jeanette Manfra, DHS**

- DHS is taking an integrated approach to both Executive Order 13636 and Presidential Policy Directive 21.
- They recognize that you cannot address cybersecurity without physical security aspects.
- Their Guiding Principles are listed on slide 5.
- Major deliverables and a timeline are on slides 6 and 7.
- One of the things they will be looking at is public-private partnership models, and how well they have been doing over the years.
- Another thing they will be looking at is their flow of information – how does it work today and how does it need to work in the future.
- They will be updating the National Infrastructure Protection Plan.
- They will be working with NIST on the Cybersecurity Framework.
- They will be publishing a report on the overall impact of the work they are implementing from a privacy and civil liberties perspective. Every Agency is required to submit their own reports on privacy and civil liberties, but DHS will be leveraging all of that work to report on this as a whole.
- For the Cybersecurity Framework, there will probably be 3 targeted workshops held around the country by NIST on targeted topic areas like “measurements.”
- None of the deliverables are intended to relate to rule making. There is a report requirement for Executive Branch regulatory agencies, but none of the DHS deliverables are intended to be a precursor to regulation.

### **SGIP 2.0 Related Items**

We have our existing GoToMeeting capabilities through March 27<sup>th</sup>. New meeting capabilities are expected to be available to us on March 29<sup>th</sup>. ### **High-level Requirements Subgroup**

This group just finished the last updates for NISTIR 7628 Revision 1. Moving forward they will be updating the NISTIR-CIP version 5 mapping.

## **Standards Subgroup**

The group is working on ITU-T G.9901, 9902, 9903, and 9904. Should have SMEs on Friday, but if they don't have them in time the call will likely be postponed by one week. They are also working with Marianne on how to continue to have SMEs help the group in the future.

## **NISTIR 7628 Users' Guide Subgroup**

The group is working on the 2<sup>nd</sup> update of the document draft. The next meeting is March 29<sup>th</sup>. An updated draft should be on the twiki for review before then.

## **Architecture Subgroup**

The group finished the diagram updates for Revision 1. Still have the defense-in-depth whitepaper to get started. Still need to continue integrating the SGAC work in with our work as it develops. The harmonization with the EU work is happening mostly in the SGAC. They are going through the list of actors making changes.

## **Privacy Subgroup**

The Privacy group had their last formal meeting under SGIP 1.0 on March 1<sup>st</sup>. The group has been notified about the draft for review/comment. Rebecca has begun work on the privacy landscape/roadmap that was requested by the SGIP Technical Committee. Marianne has some potential samples of roadmaps that may be useful for formatting ours.

## **Smart Grid Cloud Computing**

The group is planning to pull back a little and focus on a few use cases when the group re-activates. William Hadala will be leading the group going forward.

## **NISTIR 7628 Rev 1**

The first two volumes are posted for the members to review. Please look at the note to reviewers for a summary of changes in the document.
