Reminder: Voting on first 6 Standards Closes in 2 Weeks

Attention Voting Representatives: Please do not forget to vote on the first possible Catalog of Standards (CoS) inclusions.

The initial six standards on the ballot include:

- PAP 0 - NEMA SG-AMI 1-2009 Requirements for Smart Meter Upgradeability
- PAP 1 - IETF Internet Protocol Standards for Smart Grid
- PAP 2 - NISTIR 7761 Guidelines for Assessing Wireless Standards for Smart Grid Applications
- PAP 10 - NAESB Energy Usage Information
- PAP 11 - SAE J1772-TM-2010 Electric Vehicle and Plug in Hybrid Electric Vehicle Conductive Charge Coupler
- PAP 11 - SAE J2836/1 Use Cases for Communication Between Plug-in Vehicles and the Utility Grid

Per SGIP Bylaws, there is only one vote per member organization. Only Voting Representatives of Participating SGIP members “in good standing” are eligible [to vote](#). Members in good standing have attended more than 2 meetings and have not missed 1) two mandatory SGIP meetings in a row AND 2) two votes in a row.

Voting for the first 6 standards closes July 7. Results will be announced at the opening plenary for the SGIP F2F meeting in Montreal On July 12th. White House Releases New Report on Smart Grid

Last week, the White House released a new report by the Cabinet-level National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) entitled “A Policy Framework for the 21st Century Grid: Enabling Our Secure Energy Future.” The report outlines four overarching goals the Administration will pursue in order to ensure that all Americans benefit from investments in the Nation’s electric infrastructure:

- better alignment of economic incentives to boost development and deployment of smart-grid technologies;
- a greater focus on standards and interoperability to enable greater innovation;
- empowerment of consumers with enhanced information to save energy, ensure privacy, and shrink bills; and
- improved grid security and resilience.

This report was produced by the NSTC Smart Grid Subcommittee, which is co-chaired by Patricia Hoffman, Assistant Secretary, Department of Energy and Dr. George Arnold, National Coordinator for Smart Grid Interoperability, National Institute of Standards and Technology. **The full report is available at:**
